
Euro crochet patterns

Designs are organized by their circumference (the number of beaded stitches in each round) from **twelve around to twenty around**, though you can go as small as ten around and as large as forty or fifty depending on your end use AND your level of patience.

Each circumference chapter has design blanks so you can bring your own ideas to life, following the guidelines below. The blanks are positioned to show how the pattern repeats. In the simpler patterns, one repeat of the threading pattern is shown without bead counts or color numbers. More complex patterns will give detailed information on bead colors and quantity requirements.


This 19-around pattern has a repeat of 12 beads. From left to right above the same 12-bead pattern is shown from 12-around to 20-around. The threading is identical, but the resulting crocheted tube has a very different appearance, both in pattern and diameter.

The graphic at right shows two full repeats of a 12-around pattern, one with beads outlined in black and one with beads outlined in red. The red graphic is raised up by one row so the edges of the two graphs fit together.

In this configuration, the top row of the black-lined chart flows seamlessly into the second row of the red-lined chart for a continuous design.

This is the first bead loaded on the thread. Threading continues left to right, top to bottom.

The pattern when threaded in full repeats will have right and left edges smoothly joined with the pattern intact. The design blanks in each section show both a single repeat and a joined repeat of the design area, by the size of the circumference.



This narrower row (shown colored in light pink) shows the number of beads in the circumference. A design using this chart should be stitched ten-around.

This is the first bead crocheted. Your design when crocheted will be in mirror image to the chart.
